

5-year plan to End the Climate Emergency

- Reduce consumption of electric power in the northeast section of the USA called New England:
 - Join actions to stop having more high powered transmission lines built between Hydro-Québec in Canada and southern New England. The purpose of these lines is to bring more electric power to southern New England. Hydro-Québec is a huge complex of hydroelectric dams in Canada that have flooded First Nation People's land.
 - Find and join groups in Canada that are working to stop more hydro electric dams from being built on First Nations land.
 - Find and join groups in northern New England that are working to stop transmission lines being built from Hydro-Québec through northern New England to southern New England.
 - Find and join groups in southern New England that are organizing people to live with the existing power supply the region already has.
 - Use these actions to encourage people to consider that we don't need more electric power in New England and that we need to live with what we have. Eventually, start encouraging people to consider that we need to use less electric power than we currently have.
- Reduce the amount of material that goes into landfills in my state of Vermont, USA:
 - Work with Vermont's statewide plan for increasing recycling, composting more, eliminating waste going to landfills and reducing consumption.
- Stop flying:
 - Learn more about what people are doing from Flight Free Vermont, an organization that encourages people to fly less or not at all.
 - Talk with people about the environmental impacts of flying.
